

> growth of 14% over the year 2000. The production was 3.2 million tonnes, with 47% produced by local refineries and the rest by gas separation plants. Thailand has been a net LPGas exporter since 1992. Currently, in Thailand there are 7 major distributors to cater for about 4.6 million households, with a total of 8 million LPGas cylinders rotated in the market.

> On behalf of the NOC, I look forward to welcoming you to join with us in this forthcoming 15th World LPGas Forum, which will undoubtedly prove to be a productive and fruitful experience for all and certainly be worth your while.


he World LP Gas Association unites the broad interests of the worldwide LP Gas industry into one independent organisation.

HALF DAY TOURS

CHINATOWN CHARMS (Code HD 1)



A three-hour walk into some of the oldest parts of Bangkok. The route includes Chinatown with its rich evidence of the Chinese who moved to Thailand in the 18th Century. Another stop would be

Thailand's version of Covent Gardens - Pak Klong Talad where some of the most beautiful of Thai flowers, including the orchids, are sold. Other stops on the route would include temples, government buildings as well as a by-pass of the grounds of The Grand Palace.

The Suan Pakkard Palace is a complex of five traditional Thai houses overlooking a beautifully landscaped garden, with its most impressive attraction being the 300-year old lacquered pavilion decorated with 17th Century gold leaf murals and fine woodcarvings. Owned by a former Thai princess, the palace is a treasure throve of art



collections - rich with Thai culture and history.

The next stop is 'The House by the Klong' - the home of the legendary Father of Thai Silk — Jim Thompson - an American businessman who came to Thailand after the 2^{nd} World War. His disappearance in the Malaysian jungle remains a mystery to this day. His residence - housing some of the richest collections of benjarong (the traditional multi-coloured Thai porcelain) in Thailand today, and other Asian art objects - is now a museum, and a favourite stop not to be missed.

At **US\$ 40.00** per person, the price includes, two-way transfers with pick-up and drop-off at your hotel, guide services, entrance fees, and a refreshments stop. *Minimum no. for tour to operate: 6 persons.*

A DAY AT THE SPA (Code HD 3)

THE GRAND PALACE & THE VIMANMEK PALACE (Code FD 1)



No visit is complete without a visit to this magnificent palace. Built in 1782, it is an exuberant piece of architecture breathtaking with its mix of golden

domes, fluted spires and glittering temples. Most importantly the grounds of the Grand Palace houses the Temple of The Emerald Buddha, the Kingdom's most precious and revered image of Lord Buddha. The second stop is Vimarnmek Palace - ranked the largest building in the world that is made entirely of golden teak wood. Built at the turn of the 20th century, it is now a museum that boasts of some of the most beautiful collections of gifts presented to Thailand by many foreign heads of states throughout Thailand's history. Lunch is at Supatra River house - a gracious Thai home, on the banks of the Chao Phraya River, now converted into a quaint and lovely restaurant, serving superb Thai cuisine.







BANGKOK - PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Banks

Banks provide standard services Monday through Friday between 8:30 am until 3:30 pm. Many first class hotel hotels provide Money Exchange.

Car hire

All car hire agencies have desks at the airports.

Climate

Thailand enjoys a tropical climate with 3 distinct seasons - Summer from March through May, rainy with plenty of sunshine from June to September and cool from October through February. October will give us an average temperature of $26.5 \degree C$ and low humidity.

Currency Exchange / Credit cards / Travellers cheques

Major international currencies, either in the form of bills or travellers' cheques, can be cashed at banks, hotels, restaurants and most outlets. Currency exchange booths and automatic teller machines are also located in the main shopping and business districts. Credit cards are widely used and accepted. Street vendors accept only cash.

Custom Regulations

Duty free cigarettes and liquor entitlement per person entering Thailand is 200 cigarettes and 1 litre of wine or spirits. Buddha images or fragments are forbidden to be taken out of Thailand. Departing passengers cannot take more than 50 000 Thai Bahts in cash out of the country.

Departure Tax

There is a departure Tax of 500 Thai Bahts per person for international departures.

Electricity

In Thailand, the electricity voltage is 220 volt AC (50 cycles) and power sockets are mainly the two-prong flat type. For maximum convenience, visitors should have plug adaptor kits, although the hotels may have these.

Food and Drink

You are spoilt for choice when it comes to food and drinks in Bangkok. However, we do not recommend food from street vendors. Drink only bottled water. Ice-cubes in hotels and restaurants are safe, but elsewhere, be cautious.

Health Matters

No vaccines or inoculations are required unless you are coming from contaminated countries. It is advisable to ensure that your tetanus booster is up-to-date.

Good travel insurance with adequate medical cover is strongly advised.

Thai currency

The local unit of currency is the Thai Baht. Notes are in denomination of 1000, 500, 100, 50, 20 and 10 Bahts. Coins are in denominations of ten, five, one Bahts. One Baht is equivalent to 100 stangs. There are also coins for 50 and 25 stangs. At the time of printing, Euro 1.00 is equivalent to 38 Thai Bahts and US\$ 1.00 is equivalent to 43 Thai Bahts.



Time

Time in Thailand is 7 hours ahead of Greenwich mean time (GMT +7).

Tipping and Gratuities

Tipping represents a gesture of appreciation, especially if good service has been given. While most hotels and large restaurants include 10 percent service charge in the bill, it is customary to tip service staff. Where you would like to tip restaurant staff, tour guides and drivers, 10 percent tip is a good rule of thumb.

Transfer - Airport / Hotel

Bangkok International Airport is located 22 kilometres North of Bangkok. The Domestic and Cargo Terminals are also located nearby.

Siam Express, the local travel agent for the 15th World LP Gas Forum, also offers minivans and limousines for transfers between the hotels and the airport. If you need this kind of services, pre-booking is necessary. For rates and pre-booking please contact Ms Srithas at Siam Express (e.mail: srithas@siamexpress.com). Taxis are available at the authorised PublicTaxi Rank.

Travelling to Bangkok

Bangkok is Thailand's major gateway. Most visitors arrive through Bangkok International Airport which is connected by daily flights to Europe, North America, Asia and Australia by the world's major airlines. No airline company has been officially designated for your travel.

Value-Added Tax (VAT) for visitors

Visitors to Thailand on tourist visas can claim a 7 percent value-added tax on goods purchased. Shops which are able to facilitate VAT refunds with the provision of all the appropriate forms will display the "VAT Refund for Tourists" signage. Purchases for VAT refunds must be shown at the airport.

VISA

If you need visa assistance for your travel, please consult the Thai Embassy or Consulate in your country of origin. Should you need an invitation letter, please contact Colloquium.
